April 1, 2017: Chapel Readings



Each week of the liturgical year, a reading from Second Advent Scripture is delivered as part of the Saturday Communion of Fellowship Service held in the Chapel of the Holy Child. This reading follows the Sacred Calendar of the Church; that is, Prophecies and Revelations that have been received by The Church on sacred dates are recalled in a liturgical context during the appropriate season each year. This reading is delivered by the Officiant of the Communion Service (that is, Bishop Gene Savoy, or occasionally in his stead, Bishop Sean Savoy) just before the final blessings. Each service also includes a reading from the ancient scriptures, prayers, or wisdom sayings of various world religions past and present and is usually thematically related to the Second Advent Reading. This reading is delivered by the Reader right after the announcements that begin the service and is thus the first reading of the service. An audio recording of the reading from Second Advent Scripture delivered on the date above is provided here below together with a transcript of the first

reading of the service that day.

ANCIENT SCRIPTURE AND WISDOM SAYINGS

A READING FROM THE GOSPEL OF THOMAS

Jesus said, "Show me the stone that the builders rejected: that is the keystone."

Jesus said, "Those who know all, but are lacking in themselves, are utterly lacking."

Jesus said, "Congratulations to you when you are hated and persecuted; and no place will be found, wherever you have been persecuted."

“If a man had only one sense he would obtain but a one sense idea of the outside world. If another sense is added his knowledge is doubled, and so on. The best proof of the relation between increased sense perception and development is had in the study of the evolution of animal forms. In the early stages of life the organism has only the sense of feeling—and very dim at that—and a faint sense of taste. Then developed smell, hearing, and sight, each marking a distinct advance in the scale of life, for a new world had been opened out to the advancing forms of life. Sense and Senses

“It is obvious, I think, that the more senses we have, the better we can comprehend the world around us. I doubt that the senses developed in exactly the sequence Atkinson suggests

because I know there are primitive life forms that still exist with only touch, a limited sense of taste (if any), and a primitive eye spot capable of distinguishing light from dark, but little more. That seems to indicate to me that sight comes before smell and hearing, but it may vary depending on the environment the species develops in. It makes sense, though, that since sunlight is important to all forms of life, they would very early in the evolutionary process develop the ability to sense its location.

“Of course, there is one “sense” that is greater than any of the senses, and that is the mind. It is up to the mind to take the information from the senses and interpret it. . . .”

**Gary Buchanan to Speak on
Cosolargy at 2017
International Light
Association Conference**



The Reverend Canon Gary Buchanan has been invited to speak at the 2017 conference of the International Light Association, to be held in Fort Lauderdale, Florida from April 29th through May 3rd. Cosolargy International President Gene Savoy Jr and his wife Radheka will also be attending the conference.

Gary was invited to speak by the president of the organization, Anadi Martel, whom Gary met in Bulgaria at the 11th Annual Water Conference held in Sofia October 6-9, 2016. Mr. Martel offered Gary space to talk about any and all aspects of light, including "higher sciences," but advised him

to create a bridge with more mainstream science through clinical and case studies when possible and asked Gary to devote a bit of time to Cymatics and the wonderful images and videos of sound resonance which he saw Gary present in Bulgaria. Gary's time slot is for 75 minutes, including a questions period. His talk, the final presentation on the final day of the conference, will serve as final summation and conclusion to the week-long gathering.

Members of the board of the International Light Association include internationally situated physicists and many others. Dr. Jacob Liberman, who spoke at the 2012 "Spiritual State of the World Conference" in Reno is also on the board and will evidently be presenting this year. Dr. Jim Oschman, also a speaker at a number of the "Spiritual State of the World" conferences sponsored by Cosolargy International, has presented at the International Light Association conference in the past. Other presenters will include Gerald Pollack, director of the EZ water conference in Bulgaria, and Fritz Albert Popp, pioneer in biophotons. There will also be numerous individuals involved in sun-gazing and photosyntonics, light medicine and related technologies, and the study of ancient religions of the east. The 2017 conference of the International Light Association promises to be a good meet-up with people who may be interested in the principles taught by Cosolargy International. This conference may also establish inroads to other conferences and the groups that sponsor them.

ANCIENT SCRIPTURE AND WISDOM SAYINGS

A Reading from the 4th-century BC Daoist Writings of the Sage
Chuang-Tzu:

How complete was [the operation of the Tâo] in the people of old! It made them the equals of spiritual beings, and subtle and all-embracing as heaven and earth. They nourished all things, and produced harmony under heaven. Their beneficent influence reached to all classes of the people. . . . Great and small, fine and coarse—all felt their presence and operation. Their intelligence, as seen in all their regulations, was handed down from age to age in their old laws, and much of it was still to be found in the [writings of the] Historians.

But there ensued great disorder in the world, and sages and worthies no longer shed their light on it. The Tào and its characteristics ceased to be regarded as uniform. Many in different places got one glimpse of it, and congratulated themselves on possessing it as a whole. They might be compared to the ear, the eye, the nose, or the mouth. Each sense has its own faculty, but their different faculties cannot be interchanged. So it was with the many branches of the various schools. Each had its peculiar excellence, and there was a time for it; but notwithstanding no one covered or extended over the whole [range of truth]. . . . Thus it was that the Tào, which inwardly forms the sage and outwardly the king, became obscured and lost its clearness, became repressed and lost its development. Every one in the world did whatever he wished and was the rule to himself. Alas! the various schools held on to their several ways, and could not come back to the same point, nor agree together. The students of that later age unfortunately did not see the undivided purity of heaven and earth, and the great scheme of truth held by the ancients. The system of the Tào was about to be torn into fragments under all of heaven.

“Philosophers and Why We Need Them”



“The reason philosophers have trouble agreeing, then, is partly because that is the nature of the subject (philosophers deal in questions that people in general don’t agree upon) and partly because philosophers go about their business by challenging assumptions and concepts. ...

“Despite the inherent difficulty of philosophy, its value should not be underestimated. As recent discoveries in genetics and biotechnology have shown, it is impossible to know what to do with scientific discoveries without reflecting on what sort of a society we want to live in and what duties we owe to each other, our descendants and the environment. ... None of these issues are questions for science

or for art, but for philosophy.” ~Philip Stokes

The Important Job of the Philosopher

“First, we have to define what we mean by “a philosopher”. Merriam-Webster says a philosopher is one who “studies ideas about knowledge, truth, the nature and meaning of life, etc.” By that definition, I think nearly all of us could claim to be philosophers. A real philosopher, we might say a professional philosopher, goes beyond just studying those thing, but forms opinions about them and shares those opinions. Another definition is, “a person who seeks wisdom or enlightenment,” and those are the real philosophers.

“Some people seem to think than anyone who is highly opinionated and is willing to share those opinions with anyone who will listen is a philosopher. I think most such individuals would more accurately be called critics.

“As Mr. Stokes points out, the primary purpose of the philosopher is to help us use knowledge, especially science, in a way that is beneficial for us and nature, and does not destroy us after a time. Some such philosophers are called [Ethicists](#) these days, but that is just trying to rename something considered too artsy and flighty (philosophy) with a more scientific name. An ethicist is still a kind of philosopher.”

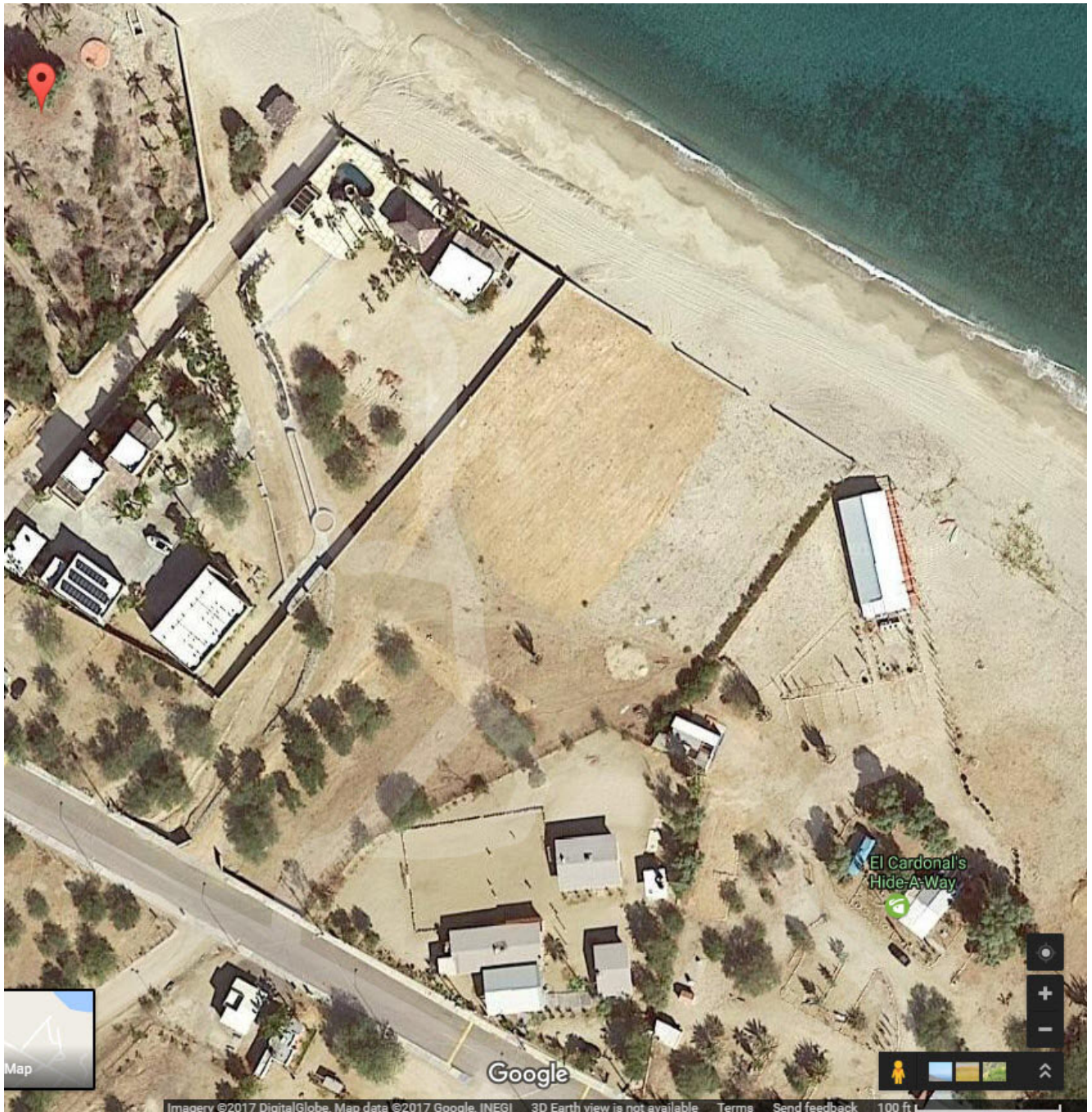

Church to Purchase Beachfront Property in Mexico for Cosolargy Center

The Church recently made arrangements to purchase 9223 square meters of beachfront property in Baja California Sur, Mexico to establish a Cosolargy Center there to serve as the headquarters for Cosolargy International in the Spanish-speaking world. Plans and photos will be forthcoming.

The property is located in the beautiful area of El Cardonal,

a 25-minute drive north of Los Barriles on the east coast of the peninsula on the Gulf of California (Sea of Cortez). (See the satellite image above.)

You can locate the property yourself on Google maps. (1) Search for “El Cardonal, Baja California Sur, Mexico.” (2) Switch to the satellite map. (3) Magnify the area indicated by the red arrow until you can make out the trees. (4) Move to the vacant seaside lot two lots down from the lot marked by the red arrow with a big Cardinal cactus in the center. That is the location.

The lot is bordered on the north by an estate. On the south by an elementary school. And on the west by the sea and 100 meters of beachfront.

Keep all this in mind when you read the letter that is already in the mail to you asking for your help to make the dream of a center in Mexico come true.
