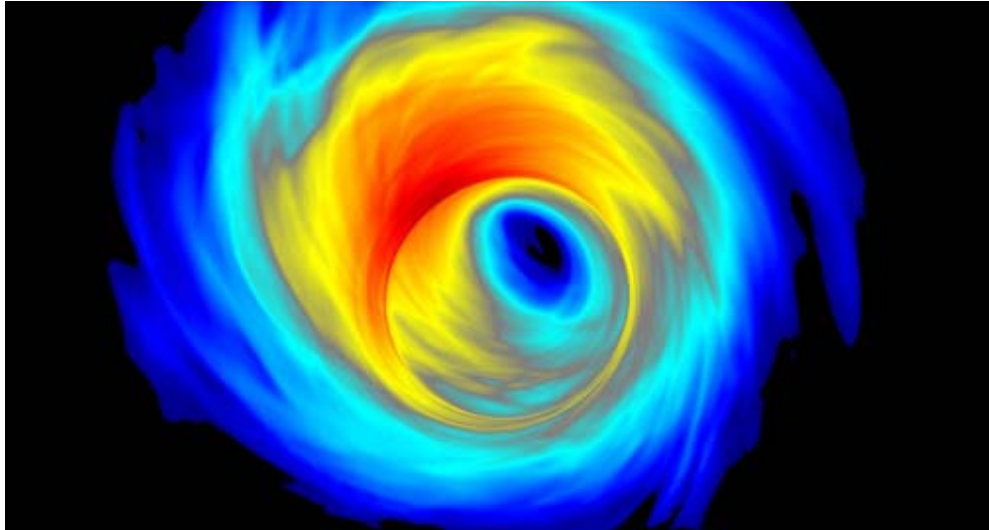


“The mysterious boundary”

“Understanding what happens at that pivotal boundary could reveal the hidden influences that have molded the universe from the instant of the Big Bang.

“Today some of the best minds in physics are fixated on the event horizon, pondering what would happen to hypothetical astronauts and subatomic particles upon reaching the precipice of a black hole. At stake is the nearly 100-year quest to

unify the well-tested theories of general relativity and quantum mechanics into a supertheory of quantum gravity.

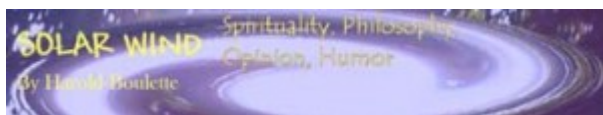
“But the event horizon is more than just a thought experiment or a tool to merge physics theories. It is a very real feature of the universe, a pivotal piece of cosmic architecture that has shaped the evolution of stars and galaxies. As soon as next year, a telescope the size of Earth may allow us to spot the edge of the shadowy abyss for the first time.

“By studying the event horizon through both theory and observation, scientists could soon figure out how the universe began, how it evolved and even predict its ultimate fate.”

“Real Philosophy”



“Plato regarded philosophy as the greatest good ever imparted by Divinity to man. In the twentieth century, however, it has become a ponderous and complicated structure of arbitrary and irreconcilable notions—yet each substantiated by almost incontestable knowledge. The lofty theorems of the old Academy

which Iamblichus likened to the nectar and ambrosia of the gods have been so adulterated by opinion—which Heraclitus declared to be a falling sickness of the mind—that the heavenly mead would now be quite unrecognizable to this great Neo-Platonist. ...

“In his treatise on Atheism, Sir Francis Bacon tersely summarizes the situation thus: ‘A little philosophy inclineth man’s mind to atheism; but depth in philosophy bringeth men’s minds about to religion.’” ~Manly P. Hall

Philosophy was once one of the great and noble fields of knowledge and its practitioners were highly respected individuals, kind of the celebrities of their day. But in modern times, real philosophy has been replaced by egotistical individuals simply stating their personal opinions about everything and calling that philosophy. Real philosophy is based on proper interpretation of divine knowledge and applying such knowledge to everyday situations. As a result of the degeneration of the field of philosophy to nothing more than the opinions found on the editorial page of the daily newspaper, there is little respect for this field anymore. While I haven’t made such studies myself, I suspect that if I were to go to a major university to get a degree in philosophy, instead of being taught how to gain access to divine wisdom (gnosis), I would be assigned to read the writing of various philosophers of the past.

It is therefore not much of a surprise that so much of the pretend philosopher of our modern times supports the idea of atheism. As Bacon said, when you just look at the surface of philosophy, or things in general for that matter, you are likely to come to false conclusions, but if you dig down deep, and keep your ego at bay, you will come to a very different conclusion.

the things I liked about it was the way it demonstrated that things are not always what they appear to be when we only view them superficially. First, we see the flock of cute little pink birds that look so cute and cuddly only to learn that they are essentially flying piranhas. Second, we find that the huge cat monster the cavemen have been hiding from for year is not chasing them to eat them, but because he wants to make friends and get his ears scratched.

Real philosophy is about getting to the truth behind the illusions, not about egotistical opinions.

Julia Sweeney Gets at the Heart of Religion



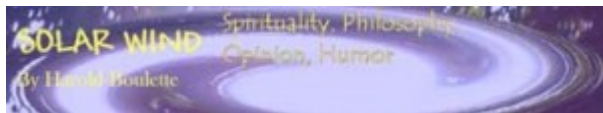

“Spiritual Places”



"Places also exercise an important influence in occult operation; some spots upon the earth's surface are naturally highly magnetic. These have usually been discovered of old time by the ancients and their possibilities developed, and according to the type of development employed will be their influence at the present day. There is a very great difference between a place which has been used for evocatory rites involving blood-sacrifice.

"Occultists having the necessary knowledge avail themselves, as far as they can, of places with magnetism already developed; but failing this, they magnetize a place for themselves, but it takes considerable time and work to do this." ~Dion Fortune

Substitute spiritual for occult, and this quote remains essentially true. While it is debatable that magnetism is the key factor, there are places that are good, great, and not good for spiritual activities. Unfortunately, it is impractical for most of us to travel all over the country or the world seeking spots of good energy to practice our spiritual techniques, and the results may actually be disappointing. When a group of Cosolargists visited Israel some years ago, they found that whatever positive energies once were there are long gone. On the other hand, we were surprised to find on our 2009 trip to Greece that the sun was quite mellow in Athens, which is very unusual for an urban area. Also, as Ms Fortune points out, strong energy or magnetic forces in a place isn't necessarily a good thing. Those energies may be very negative or of low frequencies that harm rather than aid spiritual growth.

In some cases these energy vortexes formed naturally, but most often are the result of spiritual people, especially highly developed ones, conducting spiritual activities there over a long period of time. But again, it isn't really necessary to travel to such places. In most cases, you can find a place of reasonably positive and high-frequency energy close to home. The basic rules are:

- Generally, urban areas are not good
- Mountaintops are usually good, unless there is a lot of commercial development on or around the mountain
- Seashores are also good spots, but with the same rules on development
- Forests and parks are generally good spots if there are few people around
- A garden is usually a good spot.

The main idea is to find a place where higher frequency energies are found, or can grow. If that isn't possible, at least try to avoid a place that is probably full of negative or very materialistic energies such as Wall Street or a prison yard. If you can't go to such areas every day, try to do it at least a few times a month.

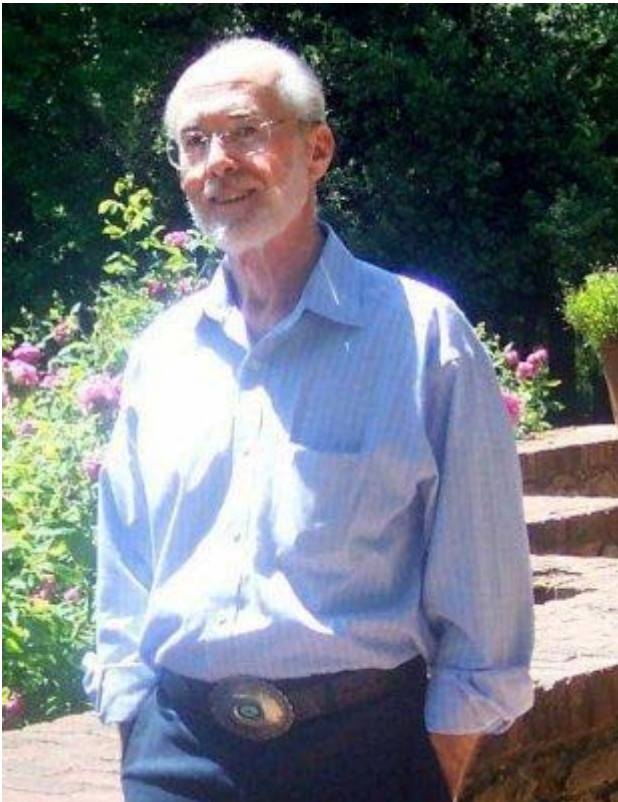
And last but not least, when you practice spiritual techniques with others, the positive energies of the group can help raise the energy of the location.

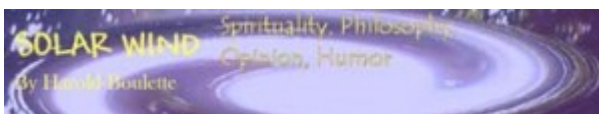

“To Save the World, Serve God”



"I do not deny you your rituals and ceremonials; worship Me if you will as you will, but bear in mind that this cannot substitute for your obligations. Ritual and worship cannot be an adjustment or payment for the things you have failed to do, or be an apology for your own shortcomings. Neither do they compensate for iniquities against your fellow men. ... Never let your duty and obligations be neglected because you worship Me diligently, following a formalized ritual and ceremonial. Let this not be an excuse for not failing to share your bread with the hungry or for neglecting the needs of the destitute or weak. I am not deceived. A life dedicated to Me is not one preoccupied with worship; that is more the life of a coward trembling before the unknown. He who dedicates his life to Me gives shelter to the homeless and succors those in distress, but even those are not the ultimate in goodness, for they are passively accepted. The ultimate in goodness is to actively combat all the root causes of evil." ~The Kolbrin Bible GLN:15:8

There are many people who think that by attending some religious service once a week for an hour or two, they have completed their obligation to God and what they do the rest of the week is not relevant. Likewise, there are those who think that if they are generous in their donations to their church, God will be merciful toward them and forgive all their behavior the rest of the week. Both are wrong. It is not that attending services is wrong, or making donations are wrong, but rather that they are not sufficient. We need to get serious about spiritual development, not just for ourselves, but for all people and for the very world we live in. This means we can't be total materialist six days a week and think we can fix that by going to a church or temple on the seventh. This means that giving money to the church won't really benefit you if you got your money by ripping off others. The quote tells us that we need to be generous and help others by feeding the hungry, giving shelter to the homeless, etc. But it then tells us that those things are not that important, that the most important thing is to fight evil by combating the root causes of evil. So what are the root causes?

The primary cause of evil in the world is that it is a fallen world. Fallen from its original spiritual state. The story of

Lucifer is an allegorical tale of this great fall, as is the story of Adam and Eve. When the fallen angels “created” the material universe, they created something that did not have the perfection of God’s creation. As a result, it is a place that has evil in the form of death, disease, struggle, and negative emotions. While well-meaning people often tell us that we simply can change the way we thing, and become loving and peaceful, history shows us that such an approach simply doesn’t work for very long. You cannot change the nature of matter as long as it remains matter, so the only permanent solution is to change matter back into spirit. Stephan Fuelling Delivers Omnia Society Lecture

Dr. Stephan Fuelling, longtime Consociate of the Community, delivered his first lecture before members of the Reno branch of the Omnia Society on Monday, June 23, 2014.

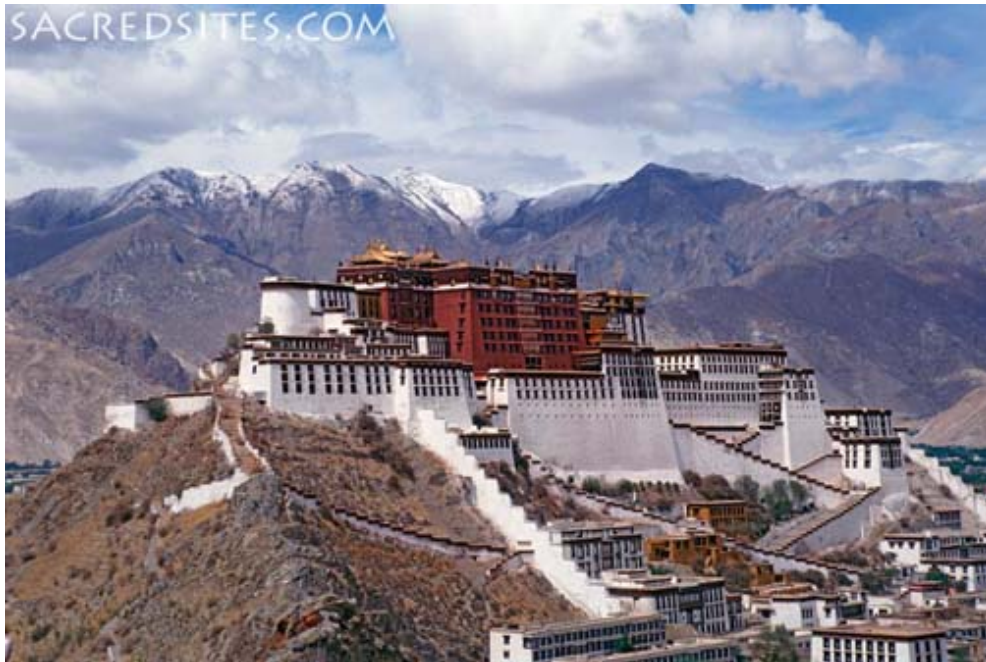
Dr. Fuelling is currently an adjunct professor at the University of Nevada, Reno and he is involved in experimental plasma physics. However, this is not his only passion. He has a great interest in alternative health.

Dr. Fuelling opened his talk with a discussion of the two “states” of water in the human body. He first discussed the highly structured water in the cells, discovered by Dr. Gilbert Ling, author of many books, including *Life at the Cell and Below-Cell Level* and further studied by Prof. Gerald Pollack, University of Washington, author of the books *Cells, Gels, and the Engines of Life* and *The Fourth State of Water*.

He then discussed the other state of water in our bodies, the highly specialized liquid of our blood. Blood is a stabilized colloidal system and its stability is determined by the Zeta Potential. The strength of the Zeta Potential has tremendous consequences for cardiovascular health, as first discovered by Thomas M. Riddick, author of the book *Control of Colloid Stability through Zeta Potential*. Dr. T.C. McDaniel, author of the book *Disease Reprieve*, who celebrated his 100th birthday this May, has used the concept in relation to cardiovascular disease in his practice for over 40 years.

Another cause of cardiovascular disease lies with 'bad dentistry,' and Dr. Fuelling discussed problems with root canals and also dental amalgam. He then described the use of 'MMS' (Miracle Mineral Supplement), a mixture of sodium chlorite and citric acid, to keep the gums and teeth healthy as well as its effect on arthritis and other health issues.

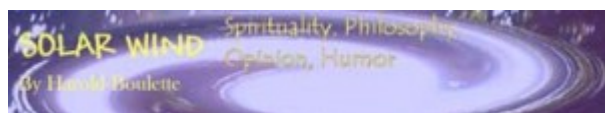

“Man Before Matter”



“According to the ancient doctrines, the soulless elemental spirits were evolved by the ceaseless motion inherent in the Astral light. Light is force, and the latter is produced by the will. As this will proceeds from an intelligence which cannot err, for it has nothing of the material organs of human thought in it, being the superfine pure emanation of the highest divinity itself—(Plato’s ‘Father’) it proceeds from the beginning of time, according to immutable laws, to evolve the elemental fabric requisite for subsequent generations of what we term human races. ... our ‘ignorant’ ancestors traced the law of evolution thought the whole universe. As by gradual progression from the star-cloudlet to the development of the physical body of man, ...” ~H. P. Blavatsky

It is not by accident that in the Bible’s Book of Genesis, God starts the creation of the world by saying, “Let there be light!” even though this creation tale is more allegory than literal truth. Creation must start with light and eventually return to light. And as I have pointer out in several recent posts, science now backs up this idea with the revelation that the supposedly very firm and real universe of matter is actually just a hologram made of light. In the remainder of the quoted section, Blavatsky goes into something a little different: an alternative to Darwin’s evolution. It is not that she, or any other spiritual person, is denying that evolution does indeed take place and explains the progress of material beings, but that it is a very incomplete picture much like looking only at the part of the iceberg that is above water. Basically, what she is saying is that we will never find the earliest version of man by digging in the ground for bones. All we can find by that method is the earliest material man, and that is not the same thing. Man was a spiritual being long before he descended into material levels of being. Exactly why our ancestors made such a stupid choice millions of years ago, I do not know, but it likely wasn’t intentional. The allegorical tale of Adam and Eve in the Bible give a good clue to what happened. By choosing to “eat” from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil,

which is not a tree in the usual sense at all, they triggered an event that led to them becoming material beings.

The good news though is that we still have a spirit and soul so we still can reverse the process with the help of God. God won't do it alone though. We have to make a concerted effort to fix it ourselves following the methods revealed to prophets and other holy ones. And we can't wait forever, time is running out.
