Blessings of the Light

Second Advent Epiphany celebrated at Sanctuary

February 2, 1982, marked the twentieth anniversary of the revelation and manifestation of The Spiritual Son of Righteousness. The Second Advent of God, His Appearance in the New Sun of Righteousness, was first witnessed in Persia on February 2, 1862.

In liturgical celebration, the Church observed a nine-day vigil from January 30 through February 6, 1982. Each morning Community members gathered at the Red Rock Conference Sanctuary, recently dedicated, for the Communion of Fellowship. The Oblation, read daily by Reverend Gene Savoy, was accompanied by the melodious sounds of bells.

The scriptural writings of Joseph The Child Christ tell us that the spirit of Joseph was lifted from his body of matter at midnight, January 28-30, 1862. The Child's First Disciple, The Man, was instructed to await a sign on the fourth day following His passing. With other companions of The Way, The Man returned to Joseph's tomb on February 2, 1962, to await the promised event.

At noon that day a great halo flamed around the sun. In the midst of a circle of rainbow colors, in the heart of the milky way, a white cross appeared. The Man saw the image of Joseph across the face of the sun, and the Holy Child was holding the Sun of Righteousness in His arms over His heart. And to the light of The Man's eternal soul, the resurrected spirit of The Child said, "The incarnation of God for Father is come to the world through the Son of Righteousness, healing and sanctifying the human family, and

restoring the Life of Righteousness."

The text continues, noting that on February 4, 1862, when the six and six planets conjoined in Aquarius, the Powers of Darkness, the Anti-Christ, would begin manifesting.

Following that manifestation, The Man began The Great Work. A New Community was to come into being as a fulfillment to the Christian Church of the First Dispensation. The Community of Light was to go out into the world, as an appointed time, and initiate Christianity in the New Advent, revealing The Sacred Teachings of Light returned into its care for that portion of humankind that would receive them.

The Man was charged with leading an Order of Righteous men and women who would go forth to let all know that the Spirit of Christ and the Sun of Righteousness — The Bread of Life — abode

in nations and peoples equally; for God seeks to immortalize the human family. Now, twenty years after The Birth of the New Sun of Righteousness, Reverend Savoy described The Church of the Second Advent as small, healthy, and with a great and noble future.

He stated, "It has taken twenty-five years for the pre-ordained to appear. It has taken that long to mature the people, create our Canon Law, motivate and publish our Prophecies and Sayings, and to complete the work of the Ship of Light."

On Sunday, February 7, the sixth morning of the vigil, Rev. Savoy officiated the Divine Service assisted by Revs. Sylvia Savoy, Philip Seydler, and Dennis Buehler. The Bell Choir, directed by Rev. Gary Buchanan, accompanied the liturgy. Traditional weekly services were held during the vigil at the Sanctuary and at the Holy Chapel of the Child Christ. •

Construction in progress

Episcopal See to house University of the Ordained

Restoration has begun to convert one of the Church's properties into the Episcopal Cathedral See.

The Episcopal See will house The Sacred College of Juvenile Theology, Seminary and Divinity School, and The Juvenile University of the Ordained.

The primary function of the See, located at 626 Raleigh Street in Reno, will encompass meetings of the Episcopacy, meetings of the Bishops, and theological lectures.

The oak-paneled interior will be con-

structed in the elegant style of a Greek amphitheater, with a ceiling reaching to a height of 11 feet. Third seating will accommodate 100 persons.

Other features will include broad teakwood doors, a concrete sign and bronze plaques, a surrounding brick and wrought iron gate, and landscaping with cedar and juniper trees.

Design and master builder is Rev. Nelson Dauchman. Foreman of the construction is Rev. Richard Floyd. Completion date has been set at June 15. •

Public worship inaugurated in Reno Episcopate Supreme Archdiocese Holy Chapel of Child Christ dedicated in inaugural public service

The new and modern Holy Chapel of the Child Christ, located in the Chancellery Building of the Community, was dedicated in Consecration Services held last August 23rd. The dedication was followed by Public Worship Services — the first in the history of the Church.

The service of consecration and the inaugural public worship service were officiated by The Right Reverend Gene Sorey, Bishop of the Sacred Queens and Episcopate Archdiocese of Nevada. The Right Reverend Philip W. Snyder acted as Assistant Pastor.

The services, which lasted one and a half hours, encompassed eleven distinct Sunday morning and consisted of an exhortation; presentation; liturgical readings and liturgy; a communion of fellowship; and a final blessing.

Rev. Snyder initiated the services with a reading of *The Discovery of Establishment of the Holy Chapel of the Child Christ of the Community of Christ Church of the Second Advent of God and Deed of Truth*, which established the use and purposes of the Chapel. "That a Priests and Priests be provided for the giving of the Sacraments and Scriptures extracted into the use of the Church," and "that it serve as a house of public worship of God at His Second Coming."

The names of Major Donors, Endowment, Minor Donors and Guild Donors were also announced. These names will be engraved on a plaque which will be prominently placed in the Chapel.

Following acceptance and signing of the document, and the affixing of the Great Seal of Christ and the seals of the Church, Rt. Rev. Sorey dedicated the Chapel with a Rite of Thanks, Invocation, and a chanted Psalm after which followed a Benediction and a Blessing to the congregation.

The Public Worship Services comprised scriptural readings, sermons, a choral of the creed of the ordinance followed by a psalm and prayer.

In his sermon, *The Dawn of the Second Coming and the New Advent Church*, Rev. Sorey stressed the manifestation of God's Image and Word in the Spiritual Son of Righteousness and God's Second Coming as Messiah, as was prophesied by Moses and the Prophets, and by Jesus.

The services reaffirmed that the spiritual Light sent from God as a gift to the human family has shined in the Second Advent and fulfilled the Church of the First Dispensation as was declared by the righteous Child of Light. It also underlined the concept and belief held by the Church that God shall manifest to mankind in a new revelation for the last and final time at His Second Coming. The sermon further emphasized the importance of the Ministry of the Second Advent which has intrinsically mature the preaching and dissemination of the Teachings of Light in Christendom and the world at large.

Prior to the final blessing Rev. Sorey called upon the congregation — the ordained, and guests (regardless of their

religious beliefs) — to participate in a consecrated meal of fellowship as a symbol of our common humanity and dependence on the One True God. All partook of the sacramental elements of bread and water over which a prayer was said calling upon God to infuse them with His blessing for the greater health of the congregation, and the unity of His ministry the world over.

Throughout the services, which began with selected Christian hymns, both, and the presentation of a song *Beloved Words*, and concluded with the traditional *Hymn to God's Son of Righteousness*, the Chapel was filled with the melodious sounds of organ music originally composed and arranged by Rev. Gary Robert Buchanan, organist and musical director of the Church. Of particular beauty were the background selections accompanying the cantatas of the liturgy.

It was fitting that the public announcement of God's Second Coming into the world, in the presence to Christ occurred at the Consecration Services of the Holy Chapel dedicated to the Child Christ who brought "Good Tidings" of this spiritual event, and who laid the foundation for the Church of the Second Advent before returning to the Father whence He came.

The services represented a milestone in the public life of the Church for with it was launched a new era of evangelical and charitable works for the uplifting of humankind which will go hand in hand with the Church's world mission to begin in 1982.

1981: EPIPHANY

The New Condition in the Sun

In the December edition of the "Community Communique" it was announced that Associates of The International Community of Christ had been following a 120-day Vigil of Reflection and Inflection centered upon the Image of Peace and Fellowship among Humankind leading to an eventual "Following" of God's Will upon Earth. That Vigil, begun on August 29, 1980 as part of the Clergy Training Program, was observed and did culminate with a 72-hour Service in the Chapel of the Holy Child, Christ Jesus, on December 29, 30, and 31.

The Liturgical Service held on December 31 was particularly important to The Community of Light, for it marked the end of an age, and was designated as a "Vigil for the End of the Old World."

The first week in 1981 was then observed by way of services with music accompanying the oral presentations of The Right Reverend Gene Savoy. Original music was composed and performed on the organ by Reverend Gary Barham. These presentations included Readings from The Community's Sacred Scripture, Sermons, Prayers and Invocations, Lectures, Communion, and Service-type Offerings. These services were held each day, January 1 through 5, these "catalytic" days coming to an end with an observance of EPIPHANY on January 6. Whereas it would be impossible to describe all that took place during those days of worship, the Associates in the field should be made aware of some relevant details which pertain to the NEW AGE upon the world.

On the morning of January 6, Associates of The Community of Light in residence in Reno met

at the Red Rock Retreat and Sanctuary for Sunrise Services. At that time a "Manifestation" took place in the Solar Ode, a New Condition, and all who were assembled there were witness to this phenomenon. The Light of God has been manifest to the Second Advent Church, and this in correspondence to the First Advent Manifestation to the "Wise Men" from the East who sought out the Christ Child, Jesus. The Second Advent Manifestation continues even now; and it is a condition dependent upon the continued Reflection and Inflection of the Ministers of this New Age Church.

In the ancient Church January 6th, Epiphany, was celebrated as Little Christmas. It was the Day of the Magi, the believed birth of Jesus. This was the day when gifts were exchanged. Centuries later December 25th was accepted as Christmas, coinciding with the Roman celebration of the rebirth of the winter sun. January 6th is a special day in the Church and is called the Second Epiphany or the Epiphany of the Parents.

Associates are aware of the fact that new dates and cycles of Canonical Order are upon The Community of Light, this as given in the Sacred Scripture of The Community. The Chronicles of these Dates and Cycles are presently being compiled in the form of a Liturgical Calendar, and in proper time will be released to Associates. This Calendar's compilation was a directive received at Epiphany, 1981, and it will be seen that all dates in the Liturgical Canon are in harmony with a higher cosmic order than is generally apparent to Students and Ministers of Cosmology. The publication and the release of this Calendar is under the auspices of the Editorial Department of The Community.

THE CLOSE OF 1980

Editorial

As given in previous "Communiqués," and as predicted in the Sacred Scriptures of The Community of Light, 1980 has been and continues to be a year of global, solar, and cosmic tension.

In an effort to conclude this tension, and as a directive of the Clergy Program, Consecrates and members of the Clergy-in-training have been following a 120-day Vigil of Reflection and Induction centered upon the Image of Peace and Fellowship among Humankind leading to an eventual "Following" of God's Will upon Earth. This Vigil will culminate in 1980 with a 72-hour service in The Chapel of The Holy Child, Christ Jesus, scheduled for December 29th, 30th, and 31st.

Justices are seen that all events upon Earth follow Divine Laws, just as the harmonies of the sky serve for the systematic division and arrangement of Time; so human society and all things that really belong together must be organically arranged.

These patterns follow periods of inactivity, receptivity, and activity, demanding a particular sensitivity to cycles and sequences, and the light Consecration essential in maintaining equilibrium in our personal lives. That is to say, each Consecrate must make the Consecration Decision to be strong and happy, despite the pull of Time.

This Second Advent Ministry of Beneficial Light, the very special gift of Life restored by God, that Message brought by The Holy Child, Jesus, will only be recognized and followed by Humankind if its attributes of Gladness, Gratitude, and Ardent Movement are unimpeded by The Sons and Daughters of Light, inducing the desire to remember and follow us into that Cause.

THE TERM: CONSOCIATE

Unmistakably, throughout the "Community Communiqués," as well as in other writings of The Community, the individual applying the System within The Community will be known as a Consociate (formerly known as an Associate).

In The Community, one assumes the status of Consociate when he or she is formally admitted into the "point-of-entry" educational institution known as the Academy. The term Consociate implies a measure of reciprocity between him/her and The Community. The Community, on the one hand, offers to teach the qualified Consociate its truths and theorems. The Consociate, on the other, by entering into this association with The International Community of Christ, makes assurance that he or she will act in such a manner as to ensure the perpetuation of The Community. He or she, therefore, cannot be a mere

recipient of services from The Community; rather, he or she is expected to assume responsibility and to support the goals and image of The Community by deeds as well as by attitude/beliefs.

A Consociate is viewed as striving for spiritual union with God; he then moves harmoniously with God and His authorized Community on earth. Community affiliation inevitably is seen as our preparatory to eventual ordination, acceptance of vows, and progressive dedication to the service of God in His Church.

Induction is provided only to those who are willing to assume these requisite attitudes of respect and deference to The Community in its rapid expansion. Those willing to agree to these preconditions, therefore, qualify as Consociates of The Community.

MEMORIAL CHAPEL OF THE HOLY CHILD COMPLETED: DEDICATION SERVICE PLANNED

The Memorial Chapel of the Holy Child was completed on July 26, 1980, with only minor additions and final touches remaining to be accomplished in the weeks ahead. This Chapel, situated on the Overlook at 643 Dalton Street, Reno, has a maximum seating capacity of two hundred persons, with a normal seating of one hundred, and serves the present liturgical needs of the Community in Reno. It also serves as a Small Church for training of Ministers in the Seminary and Divinity School of the Sacred College of Jordanian Theology.

This very beautiful Chapel is unique and original, designed for the specific needs of the Church of the Second Advent of Christ. The interior was planned and designed by Right Reverend Gene Sawyer and Associate Nelson Dahlstrom, who was also the Church Construction Supervisor. Jack Updyke, a building contractor from California, also contributed his expert knowledge and assistance, as well as some building materials. His firm was also instrumental in the acquisition of the mahogany pews which now grace the sanctuary.

The building of the Chapel was a tremendous experience shared by all Reno members. Special mention should be made of the assistance given by Phillip Snyder, Stan Fortmeyer, Roger Reid, Gary Buchanan, Robert Petrowsky, Bob Chavira, Sandy Rogers, Richard Floyd, Nub Mahan, John Miller, Gary Drake, Ted Stover, Gary Kasi, and Peter Van Blommeste.

All during the project food and refreshments were provided by women of the Community. On many occasions work continued in twenty-four and forty-eight hour shifts. Outstanding in this area were Elvira Singh, Sylvia Harvey, Jackie Gershman, Gao Moad, and Penny Hryd.

The job of changing a 35-by-32-by-12-foot former art gallery, a dark room without any opening for daylight, into a Chapel dominated by light was indeed a challenge. Old materials were stripped away, 200 square feet of skylight were installed, a new roof was added, the floor and part of the walls were tiled, and the ceiling and walls were covered with beautifully designed mahogany paneling.

In the Chapel area, a tremendous triangular arch of beams 6½ by 2½ inches supports a "floating" communion table and reaches to the center of a 10-by-10-foot skylight. On the apex of the Chapel is a 14-foot white granite cross on which is mounted a 5-foot bronze Communion cross especially made and donated by Brian Davidson from Canada.

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SAYINGS IV OUT: PROPHECY BEING PREPARED

Following readings given during the December sessions held in Reno, and in particular the annual meeting of the ORDER of the HOLY CHILD on December 1, VOLUME IV of The IMAGE and the WORD was prepared for publication and released to each block de jour within the field. Associates are reminded that the ORDER of the HOLY CHILD was founded by command of the holy messengers, CHRIST CHILD, JAMIL, and that admission to the ORDER is an essential step in the life of each aspiring Minister of Christ. The "Sayings" contained within The IMAGE and the WORD are periodically released for the specific purpose of guiding this Ministry and for Community forward into the Light of God.

Also following the presentation given by Reverend Stryder on Sunday, December 2, initial production was begun on The PROPHECY of the END TIMES. The printing and release has been temporarily delayed so that important editorial changes and final touches may be accomplished. The volume is expected to be released to Associates sometime in May of 1980. Associates are also reminded that publication of material so sensitive and volatile demands that the final copy be especially well-prepared and presented at exactly the right time.

This revelation, being far more detailed, specific, and vivid than those presented in times past, and which so clearly gives dates, cycles, and the future of our planet through 1999, must be presented to the world in accordance with those dictates of time, which are multi-dimensional, and which must be followed if maximum impact upon mankind is to be achieved.

PROJECT X IN CHINA

To comply with the directives of the SECOND PROJECT of the ANCHORAS, Ministers and Associates of The International Community of Christ accompanied Gene Stryder to mainland China between January 20 and February 12, 1980.

Those accompanying Right Reverend Stryder were his wife, Sylvia; Philip Stryder; Diana Baugh; Roger Kell; Gary Mendi; Tyrus Power; Arlene Power; Katherine Wynn; Lee Strickow; Donald Warner; Ernest Agnew; John Gault; and Jim Gault.

The visit was also in coincidence with Community cycles established by events surrounding JAMIL in 1962, and which may be reviewed in the Community's publication, JAMIL the CHILD CHRIST.

Briefly, those events would include:

- 1-Midnight, January 29-30, 1962, the Passing of the Child following a four-month stay in the Andes.
- 2-Intermediary events.
- 3-February 2, 1962, JAMIL's Appearance and Proclamation of the Sun of Righteousness.
- 4-February 4, the Sun and Six Planets Conjoin in Aquarius and accompanied by manifestations of the Antichrist.
- 5-February 6, The Great Work Begins.

The History in China began with a three-day stop in Shanghai where Community members toured a workers' residential area, a farming commune, and the beautiful Yu

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COMMUNITY MOVES INTO NEW FACILITIES

During February, 1979, the International Community of Christ moved its Chancery Office from Arlington Towers to its own building at 643 Ralston Street, Reno, Nevada, 89503.

Since that time, the Community has also acquired a building directly across the street from the Chancery. The annex will house most of the Production Department.

Community members have been working at the Chancery planting trees, landscaping, putting up a fence, and generally preparing the church building for chapel services, seminars, and meeting the public.

FEATHERED SERPENT II IS IN HAWAII

The Community's Ship of Light, the Feathered Serpent II, is now in Hawaii. Having arrived there on June 3, 1979, Day of Pentecost, it is berthed at Kure Lagoon, Honolulu.

Preceding a voyage of twenty-two days, the ship was off Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. It was captained by Gene Sawyer, and the crew members were Phillip Snyder, Kjell Soren, John Mahan, and Robert de la Cruz. Asociado de la Cruz is currently overseeing the repairs and well-being of the vessel.

It is hoped that in time the Community may bring the ship to Reno, where it will serve as a museum and symbol of the Prophecies and Sayings given on board.

CLERGY PROGRAM CONTINUES TO GROW

The Clergy Program of the Community is now into its second full year. There are thirty-seven select students in residence, Reno, whereas thirty-eight students receive tapes by mail.

At the Community Center, fifteen students are members of Clergy I; twenty-two are involved in Clergy II.

The Clergy Program is the essential third stage of study in the Community's mission to mankind. The Church of the Second Advent offers this program to students who have completed the lesson materials of Academies I and II, and who wish to be considered for the three-year residence program of advanced oral instruction.

This group of disciples, designated as such through the authority of the Church as given by Jesus the Child Christ of the Andes, bears the responsibility of disseminating the New Teachings of Light, and are assigned the task of creating the foundations of a new universal religion of Light, a Community of order and unity that can be used as a vehicle upon the earth by the Worlds of Light for the re-establishment of divine theocracy therein.

As professional teachers of Light, the Clergy will be required to perform all of the sacred rituals and ceremonies that implement the Christ force upon the planet as transmitted through the office of Christ, and as demonstrated by Christ incarnate within Jesus.

The First Clergy are designated as direct disciples of the revealed religion of the Church of the Second Advent. Members of the First Clergy program are assigned the mission of creating
