

The Traits of a Good Ruler

“The good ruler should not speak falsehood; he should be as great as his responsibilities. Each word should be weighed before spoken, for it is accepted as gold and not as thistledown. He should take heed of his own judgments, for the judgments of eternity draw near. He should be, above all, an example to all men. The gardener of wickedness waters his land with deceit, and it brings forth falsehood. The good ruler should be above every deed of meanness; he should be the father of the orphan and the husband of the widow. A true leader of the people should be free from every kind of avarice, a man above every kind of pettiness. He should be a man of wide vision. He should be like the rising waters that feed the fertile fields. He should be swift and sure to execute judgment on him, to whom punishment is due. O where does he sleep today, in what generation will he come forth?”

Speaking Lies

A good leader does not speak lies. That doesn't just mean that he refrains from telling stories that are complete fabrications; it also means he doesn't tell partial truths, which is another way to lie. There are exceptions to this rule, as there are to almost all rules. You don't tell a person they are ugly or stupid, even if it is true. Sometimes, good manners override the need to tell the truth. It is also necessary, especially today, for governments to keep some things secret, as revealing them to the general public can be dangerous. The quote says should weigh every word before it is spoken, “for it is accepted as gold”. In other words, it is assumed that the leader doesn't lie. Once that assumption is proved false, the leader may never be trusted again.

Take Heed of His Judgments

While in a sense, it is only God who can judge us, a leader must judge people who behave poorly, or appoint judges to do it for him. As the quote indicates, the leader will die one day and be subject to the judgment of God's Law, so he must judge others fairly.

Be an Example

A good ruler doesn't act one way while expecting others to act differently. The good ruler acts as he expects others to act. If a ruler is frequently looking for ways to mistreat certain groups of people because of their religion, race, color, etc., He should not be surprised if people look on him the same way. If a ruler looks for ways to steal the natural resources of other nations, he should not be surprised when other nations try to steal the resources of his nation. If a ruler tries to find reasons to start wars, he should expect others to do the same to his land.

Free from Avarice and Pettiness

There was a time when kings and other leaders did not deal in avarice. In the past century, we have seen several leaders overthrown or assassinated because of their avarice. Yet that has not stopped modern leaders in several countries from being full of avarice. The good leader also avoids all forms of pettiness and does not react with anger when someone disagrees with him or makes a joke about him.

Wide Vision

A good leader should be a man of wide vision. That means more than just a wide vision of what is happening in the world on the physical level, but also he must have vision of the spiritual. This means that the good leader must be spiritually developed, or at least must have trusted advisors who are spiritual leaders.

The Corrupt Pharaoh is Denounced



“Hepoa went before Pharaoh, and there, in the midst of his court, he denounced him. These were the words issuing from the mouth of Hepoa, as set down by the attending scribe: “O great and mighty Pharaoh, where once the stormwind raged, there is now a gentle breeze. Where once the diligent shepherd stood, now a musician sits and idly plays. The land is no more as it was, and no man remains content within his dwelling. The northwind has ceased to enter the land, and the

south wind eats it up. A heavy hand lies on the hearts of men, and their limbs are sluggish; they are languid and move no longer, as once they did. Wherefore has all this come about, the people ask, and I answer them truly, it is because the protective power has departed from the blood of the Pharaoh; it is because of the iniquity in the palace. This is a time of woe. These things I have spoken before the eyes and ears of Pharaoh, beyond the palace gates. Yet, it is not in me to leave them unsaid before the face of the king himself. Where is the great one, who sets goodness in the place of wickedness? Where is he, who replaces injustice with justice, who hears the cry of the lowly? Who causes right to prevail in the land? Where is He? I look, and I look in vain. I see only one, who has defiled the protective treasures, the glory of Egypt, with iniquity. I see only one, who has polluted the pure stream with the sewage of evil, who has

succumbed to the ultimate in wickedness. This I see, as all men see it, but I am one, who sees more. I see an Egypt gone down into dust. I see plague and death stalking the streets. I see the fertile, black waters turned back on themselves. I see the black land buried beneath the sand. I see grim-faced men coming from out of the East to stamp the land flat in blood. I see the dread things of the past recurring. I see desolation spread out on every side. Woe to you, great Pharaoh; woe to the land of Egypt! Goodness lies dying beneath the triumphant foot of evil. Virtue is betrayed into the foul hands of

loathsome lust, her despairing cry unanswered by any coming to her aid. Wickedness walks unhampered through the cities, and wrongdoing is seen on every side. Woeful are these days, and doomed are those who endure them. What does the great light shining forth from the palace conceal, sacred mysteries or secret sins?" Then, the arm of Pharaoh stretched forth to stop the mouth of Hepoa, and it was stopped. He was led forth, and whips were laid on his back, and he was placed

within a dungeon."

Hepoa Denounced the Pharaoh

We are not told who Hepoa is, but from his actions, we can assume that he is a high priest or leader of a spiritual temple. What he says to the Pharaoh sounds mild by today's standards, but it is obvious that the Pharaoh didn't see it that way. When Hepoa says, "where once the stormwind raged, there is now a gentle breeze," he is saying that the once strong pharaoh has become weak, at least in his handling of the wickedness spreading throughout Egypt. As a shepherd, the Pharaoh was the caretaker of the people, but when Hepoa says "now a musician sits and idly plays," he is saying that the Pharaoh is not doing his job as caretaker of the people.

The Land has Changed

It is not stated how the land has changed, but this whole section of the Kolbrin Bible is about the spiritual leaders and mystery schools leaving Egypt for another land. The land itself is not changing, but the people are. It is curious that the author of the quote seems to equate a north wind with good things and a south wind with evil. Again today we now say that things have gone south when they are headed in the wrong direction.

Inequity in the Palace

A good pharaoh treats all people with equality. This pharaoh is no longer doing that. We can assume he is favoring the rich and powerful, something we see a lot of today. Hepoa asks, "Where is he, who replaces injustice with justice?" He is accusing the pharaoh of not ruling with justice and fairness. He says this to the pharaoh himself.

The Sewage of Evil

Here, Hepoa is saying that because the pharaoh has opened the door for evil to enter the land, as a result, there is death and disease everywhere. The waters are polluted, and the fertile black soil has been buried in sand. In short, evil spreads everywhere like a plague.

Whipped and Jailed

As might be expected, the pharaoh was not happy with this criticism, and he had Hepoa whipped and thrown into a dungeon. Hepoa probably expected that to happen, yet he felt he had no choice but to speak up against the evil. We could use more people like Hepoa today.

The Pharaoh Introduces a New Form of Worship



"The new form of worship introduced by this Pharaoh was simple enough. Outwardly, it had all the symbols and ceremonial beloved by the people, with sufficient substance

in it to attract the spiritually inclined. It could have formed a fitting gateway to the Path of the True Way, another light guiding men along the road to the embarkation port for Truth. Behind the symbols and ceremonial, the Pharaoh worshiped the Spirit behind the Sun, the Spirit of Light and Life as a direct, fully conscious member

outflowing from The Great God Behind All. The king, however, being cut off in the midst of his instruction, perceived the road but dimly. There is little doubt of his genuine desire to bring the True light to the people, but he was not wise enough to know, firstly, that one who brings light must be one in whom light burns brightly, and secondly, that the multitude cannot be exposed to its unveiled brightness with impunity. The king, severed from his weaknesses, could have been a truly great ruler, a steady light before the eyes of men, the guide to a new age for the people of the land. But he was one who cast heavily on both arms of the balances.”

New Form Of Worship

The quote says the pharaoh introduced a new form of worship, yet it had much of the old religions, the spiritual ones taught in the temples and Mystery Schools, to satisfy both the regular people and the more spiritual ones.

Spirit Behind the Sun

This Pharaoh worshiped the Spiritual Sun, which the quote calls the spirit behind the sun. It is more accurate, however, to say that the Spiritual Sun is within and around the physical sun rather than behind it. Many people mistake this for sun worship, but it is not the sun itself that is being worshiped, but the God beyond that Sun. The quote says that this sun was a “ fully conscious member outflowing from The Great God Behind All.” That is an excellent way to word it. It

tells us that while the Spiritual Sun acts as a kind of portal between Heaven and Earth, it is a conscious being in its own right.

The King Cut Off

It is not explained why the Pharaoh was cut off in the middle of his instruction, but it was probably because the spiritual school he was going to shut down or relocated because of the changing times. Nonetheless, he tried to bring the light to the people. As the quote says, one who tries to bring the light to others by teaching them how to develop their own spiritual faculties must be an advanced master of the teachings.

The Multitude Cannot Be Exposed

While well-meaning people think that if someone has spiritual knowledge, it should be shared with anyone who is willing to listen, but that is not true. Exposing people to such teaching when they are not ready can result in them harming themselves. Famous painter Vincent Van Gogh may have been one person who was driven insane by accidentally gaining knowledge he didn't know how to handle. It can also result in harming others when people misuse the knowledge. Hitler is one person who gained spiritual knowledge he used to harm others.

O God, How Shall Your Servants be Saved



"The Leader of the Light cried out, "O Great God, what can I do; how shall your servants be saved? What shall be done unto those who have profaned your sacred shrines? What can I do to turn back the rising waters of iniquity and temper the wild winds of wickedness? How can the black cloud of ignorance be lifted? What shall be the just reward of those who have slain the faithful?" The voice coming forth by the Spirit of God said, "Concern yourself not with those who have persecuted you, leave them to follow the path of their own choice. Vengeance is with Me; I will measure without stint. Justice never sleeps and never forgets; the reward of the wicked awaits them. In the Hall of No Hiding Place justice will speak the final word.

"The Leader of light and those with him fled into the land beyond Shari and built there the Temple in the Rock, which stands against Shina. In this land, the forces of the Dark Ones were cast back; yet still, some among the faithful

beseached their God to save them. Thus it has ever been, this is the nature of man that in his hour of distress he cries out to God in bitterness of heart, and they who deserted God in better times expect Him to turn towards them. Yet such is the nature of God that this He would do, were

it to the good of men, which it is but rarely. In the land of Egypt, the great shrines were deserted by the Enlightened Ones and abandoned by Truth. They became places of darkness. They were as lamps without flame, as fields without crops, as wells without water."

The Leader of the Light

The Leader of the Light was probably the head of the largest of the mystery schools of ancient Egypt. He earned this title by being the most spiritually developed person in the school. He is pleading with God to help save those who have remained true servants of God. He also asks that the "cloud of ignorance" be lifted from those who remain. In Cosolargy, we understand that ignorance is the cause of all sin, specifically, ignorance of God. Those who know God do not sin, as they know they are only harming themselves by doing so.

Do Not be Concerned with Those Who Prosecute You

This is a difficult directive to follow, but we should try our best. Because of the way our subconscious mind works, what we dwell on is what will most likely happen to us, so if we dwell on those who prosecute us, we invite more of that behavior into our lives. If we dwell instead on love and forgiveness, we reduce the ability of evil to affect us.

Temple in the Rock

We don't know where this temple is, but it is most likely somewhere in Greece. We know that is where the remnants of the

great Mystery Schools of ancient Egypt went after their nation lost its way. We can assume that “Shina” is another name for Satan. Schools and temples of truth and spiritual development have always opposed the evil of Satan and his followers, not by returning violence with violence, but by practicing love and sending thoughts of peace, love, and harmony into the world.

Be One Worthy of Greatness



“Be ever above price. One worthy of the greatness you reflect

on Earth, one ever above mundane things. Be not as the ferryman who demands payment before his task is fulfilled, who bears upon the water the man who makes payment and no other. Be as the sun, whose brightness seeks out every nook and cranny and pours light into their hidden gloom. Be one who shines among men to lighten their days. Spread uprightness and honesty across the two lands, as the sunshine spreads brightness and warmth. Cover the land with goodness, as the rising waters cover it with fertility. Fill the land with strength, as the northwind fills it with contentment.

“Guard Your heart, as a father guards his daughter, as a mother guards her baby, for it is the stronghold of integrity. Be vigilant concerning every deed, for the eyes of men are ever upon you, the life you

live is not yours alone. You are the image, which men will imitate, and you are before every eye. The blowing wind will open its ear at your windows and spread wide its report. The flowing waters beside your door will uncover their eyes and carry what they behold through the land. Your position makes

you a supporting pillar of the government; if the pillars be rotten, the roof crashes. Your responsibilities will beset your life with care; the road you journey is stony and encompassed with pitfalls and thorns. The cup You drink will be more often bitter than sweet.”

Be Above Price

This doesn't mean that you can't get paid for the work you do. It means that you don't base your ethics and morality on money. A job or career that pays more isn't necessarily more worthy than a lower-paying one. Of course, your talents and abilities have to be taken into account, but you still need to choose what is moral and ethical.

Be Not Like the Ferryman

Most of us really have no choice in this. If we work for someone else, they pay us only after the work is done. If we work for ourselves, we can't expect payment in advance. But the ferryman is one exception to this rule. Obviously, the ferryman can't wait until he has traveled to the other shore before asking for payment. While that might work in some cases, it does make sense for him to ask for payment in advance.

Be Like the Sun

The sun does not expect payment for sending its light out to all. But it is true that the Spiritual Light sent out by the sun is not absorbed by the materialist. One needs to develop their Spirit in order to absorb Spiritual Light.

Cover the Land with Goodness

Being a spiritual person isn't just a matter of developing yourself. We also need to do what we can to help others. Sometimes, that will be done by directly helping a specific person. More often, it will be simply sending some of the energy we take in back out into the world, filled with thoughts of peace, love, and harmony.

Guard Your Heart

In many ancient writings, "heart" actually means your spirit. So this means that you should take care to guard your spirit against evil influences. One way to do this is to visualize the Community Cross in front of the sun when you practice solar techniques. Another is to avoid people who make you feel uncomfortable or tired whenever you are around them. In situations where you must be around such people, you can visualize a shield of light around you, blocking out their influence.

Rulers and Princes of Truth and Justice



"Where, today, are the rulers and princes this land once knew? Where are similar officials to be found? Today, bribery creeps behind the seats of judgment, corruption lurks on the right hand, and perjury sneaks around to the left. From the Temple of Man

The ancient students of the spiritual temples were faithful servants of truth, and were guided with humility, grace, and love. Their eyes saw without prejudice, meaning they did not treat people differently because of their race, religion, sex, or nationality.

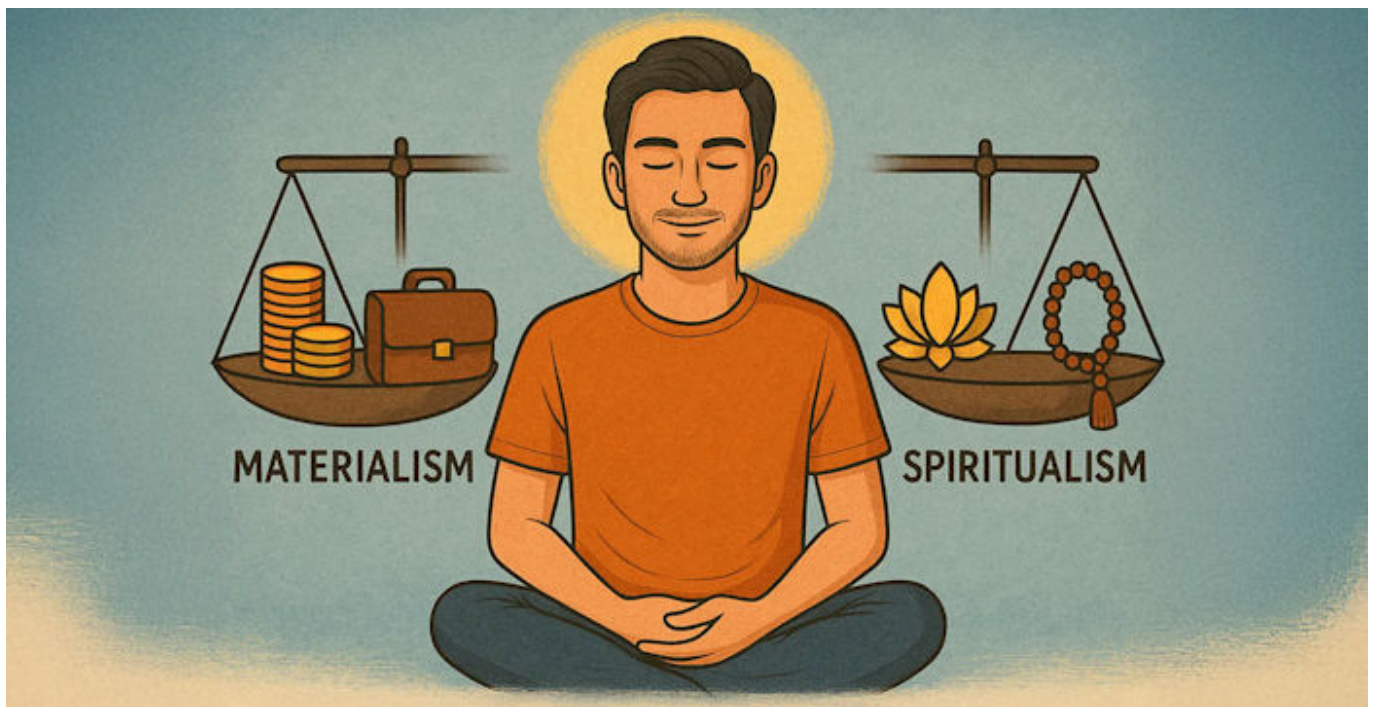
The Robe of Learning

The Great Flood and the Brotherhood of Light



“Then came the year of the great flood of waters, though some say it was before these days, when the salt seas rose upon the East and covered the land. Men were warned beforehand by the shortening of the days of the years, and the five days now added to the days of the year are days of sorrow for the alteration of things. It is said that seven days before the coming of the waters the sun appeared in a different quarter, but this is not easy to believe as the sun remains ever constant. The sailors of the king

certainly departed for strange places during the chaos of waters, perhaps this was because the sun had left his steady course.

“Kings came and departed to their place. They ministered unto the people according to the light revealed unto them. Most knew only the veiled Truth. but in olden times, they were better kings than in later days. There were long generations of men who walked with wisdom, and among them was the generation of the First Great Master, he who established the Brotherhood of the Chosen Ones of Light. The Great Flood

Most of us are familiar with the story of the Great Flood through the story of Noah and the Ark found in the Bible. Most people are not aware, however, that there are similar stories of a Great Flood found in many lands and in the scriptures of many religions. The stories may be exaggerated, as modern science tells us there is no way the seas could rise to the point of covering all of the land. Yet physical evidence has been found in recent years that many areas that are now dry land were at some time underwater.

Shorter Days and Longer Year

The quote tells us that this great event involved more than a flood. It caused the days to get shorter and the year to get five days longer. Probably the only thing that could have caused all of that is a large asteroid or a small planet

passing close to the Earth. Immanuel Velikovsky believed it was the planet Venus that entered our solar system from outside. He wrote about this in his 1950 book, *Worlds in Collision*. Scientists today consider his work nonsense, yet it does explain some things better than any other theories available.

Kings Administered

There were times in the past when Kings were somewhat knowledgeable in the Teachings of Light. Some were students of the great mystery schools, others had advisors who were. In either case, they administered according to God's Will, and not the whims of man or the forces of darkness.

Brotherhood of the Chosen Ones

We don't know what group the quote refers to as The Brotherhood of the Chosen Ones of Light, but we do know that such groups have existed throughout the history of man. At some times, and in some places, they operated openly and with the full knowledge of the government. In others, they had to remain secret due to the governments becoming dark and materialistic. In all cases, they were careful to teach only those who would use the knowledge wisely.

“Then, there was peace throughout the land, and the two priesthoods dwelt together in tolerance; but, behold, the day came when the hearts of men turned again to strife. Then, the land was rent in twain, and the forces of the Red Reed Crown strove against those of the White Lily Crown. Once, again the dark mists of ignorance descended to envelop the hearts of men. Again, the sacred shrines of Truth were closed, and those who served Truth withdrew behind the veil and were

hidden from the eyes of those who would profane her. The whole land was torn apart, from upstream to downstream; from the right hand to the left of Egypt, there was strife.

“Then came one who was mighty among men, one who also knew Truth and saw the wickedness of the people. He was a Declared One, for unless a man be such, he has no value among the chosen. He carried the sword among the striving peoples, and in his day, the might of Mantethrop prevailed. The spirit of Hori, who took the land from Namah, and of Minis, who united it, were with him. Sacred Shrines Closed

Those who ran the Sacred Shrines of Truth and Light closed those schools and hid truth from those who would profane such knowledge by using it for material purposes, or for the material benefit of themselves. This resulted in much strife in Egypt, much as we are seeing in the world today, where it is country against country, region against region.

A Holy Man Came

God does not tolerate for long the fall of truth and wisdom and sends holy men to bring the teachings back. Jesus and Buddha were such Messiahs. There were several others. Such Holy Men are declared as such by God, not men. In times when truth is hidden, men will declare holy men and women based on false criteria, but they are not real holy people. Righteousness did not attend later Kings

The Great Light, being God's Light that comes to us through the Spiritual Sun, went out. But now that Light has returned in the form of the Sun of Righteousness, which grows stronger every day and is helping to awaken more and more people. We can help by bringing that Light into us, then sending some out to others filled with thoughts of peace, love, and harmony.

Before Creation only God Existed



“About the days of Nun, we have no knowledge. Before creation commenced there was the One Father/Mother Being and from this Divinity came the heavenly Twins. From these were born three, and the three became many. Thus, even in the beginning it was divinely ordained that brother and sister might be wed. From the first Heavenly Twins were born those whose destiny it was to be eternally married. For theirs was the divine right of eternal and undying love, a love unknown to mortals, but to which, if they would be more than mortal, they must aspire. This love is the Light of Life, the Light of the Earth, the Sun of the Spirit.

“The Originating Divinity is called many names among men, and

in Egypt His names are hidden in other names. Among the Chosen Ones, He is called The Craftsman Creator, but men and women name Him differently among the people. Likewise, some say 'Him' while others say 'Her;' it is all alike, for these are no more than the words and distinctions of mortal man. Before Creation

Before creation, God was the only thing that existed. God has always existed, and always will. The quote refers to God as "Father/Mother", which is accurate. God is unlimited, so to think of God as being only male or only female is putting limits on God.

Heavenly Hierarchy

The quote says that from the one God came the heavenly twins. From the twins came three, then five, then ten, and so on. This established a Heavenly hierarchy of Light Beings. These Light Beings, or angels, were 100% spirit. It was only later that some descended into matter, becoming the fallen angels. While the quote says it was ordained "brother and sister might be wed," this doesn't mean literally that one should marry their brother or sister. It means that a male should marry a female. That, however, is not necessarily God's Law, but it is the law of the people who wrote this section of the Kolbrin Bible.

Eternal Love

Eternal Love is not only the divine right of the Heavenly Twins, it is also the divine right of all of us. God's love for us is eternal, and our love for God should be eternal and

unlimited also. When we develop that kind of love, we will also love all people, regardless of their race or creed. We will love all beings, including animals and plants. We will love all of creation, even the distorted part created by the Demiurge, for it too is one with God, and will eventually return to that condition.

Light of Life, Sun of the Spirit

The author of this part of the Kolbrin Bible knew that God is Light, and that God's Light flows to us through the Spiritual Sun. Now that we are in the End Times, that Light is the Sun of Righteousness, which grows stronger every day and is helping in the process of converting matter back into Spirit.

Heaven

Heaven can be called the center of God, the highest level of consciousness, or the One. It is all the same. I can find no other reference to "Newit", but it either refers to Heaven or the Godhead. We don't need to confuse ourselves with the names men give these things; just know that the goal of spiritual development is Oneness with all and universal Love.
