Bishopstead project nears completion

Parsonage extension is solar heated

The expansion of the Bishopstead on La Fond Drive in Reno is drawing to completion. The "east wing," an addition of a 10,800 square-foot structure to the existing Rectory-Abbey, will serve as parsonage for The Reverends Tyrus and Arline Peace, Archiater of the Church. It will also house the Head Bishop's Study and Private Library.

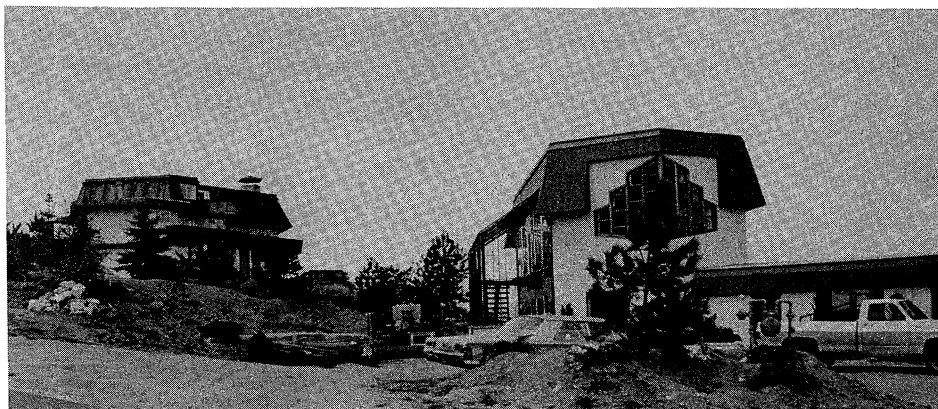
The building features two solariums which collect solar heat that is circulated throughout hollow walls by blowers. Exterior walls are heavily insulated for heat retention, affording a near-100 percent efficiency of solar energy conservation. A back-up electrical heating system takes over during cloudy days. On hot summer months, night air is drawn into the solariums to cool the structure, maintaining a constant comfortable temperature inside the dwelling.

Connecting foot-paths, desert gardens, terraces landscaped with numerous pine trees and juniper shrubs, and a continuous concrete-block retaining wall with ornam-

ental iron fence will embellish the grounds.

The Building Guild, under the oversight of its Director, The Reverend Nelson Duchesneau, is responsible for ninety-five

percent of the construction. The project was begun in August of 1982 and is scheduled for completion by the end of this year. ♦

Parochial School begins academic year

Emphasis is upon wide-range learning

The Jamilian Parochial School began the 1983-84 academic year on Saturday, September 3 with a 4-day Orientation during which schedules were presented and explained to parents, students, and faculty.

As a co-educational parochial institution, the School presently provides for the education of children, ages 6 to 13, whose parents or guardians are ministers under vows.

This year's curriculum offers a broad range of academic and pre-seminarial instruction. In Middle School, students will be prepared, at Grade Level, in the following subjects: Spanish, Chinese, Reading, American and World Literature and Composition, Language Arts, Mathematics,

Science, Health and Anatomy, American and Global Studies, Environmental Studies, Etiquette and Decorum, Art, Calligraphy, Practical Arts, Safety and Survival.

The Elementary School offers studies in Spanish, Language Arts, Reading, Spelling and Handwriting, Mathematics, Science, Health, Social Studies, and Art.

All students participate in the Aquatics Program, as well as in Music, Handbell Choir, Chorus, Religious Studies, and Chapel Services.

Other physical recreation activities are undertaken on a weekly basis, individually; or in group, periodically, under the auspices of the School Administration.

SCHOOL

The Parochial School is an integral part of the Church, and though it is still in a stage of infancy, the educational program constitutes a true pre-seminarial branch of the Church of the Second Advent. The role of instructors and students is inseparable from the Church's New Age Ministry. It is indeed hoped that the School will not only serve as preparatory ground for future righteous citizens of the world, but that from its precincts will come forth Ministers of The Way of Light.

The Church Administrator of the Jamilian Parochial School is The Reverend Robert Petrovich. Assistant to the Administrator is The Reverend Barbara Snyder. The faculty is composed of ordained ministers-in-training who are appointed by the Sacred College Board of Education.

The Reverend Petrovich works in close accord with the Advisory Committee to

the Board of Education and the Department of Canon Law, and under the personal supervision of The Most Right Reverend Gene Savoy.

At present, the School Administration is earnestly endeavoring to expand the study programs to include a full twelve-grade curriculum. ♦

Community Sinfonietta begins rehearsals

An ensemble of divers instruments, the Sinfonietta of the International Community of Christ was inaugurated in early August of this year.

Ministers-in-training and Consociates of the Church came together in Reno under the baton of Music Director, The Reverend Gary. R. Buchanan. A series of inaugural rehearsals featured traditional orchestral sonorities with bells and organ.

Members of the Sinfonietta are Gail Fosbury (Rev.), C Tranverse and G Alto Flutes; Ms. Ruby van Klaveren, C Flute; Carol Salverson (Rev.), Violin and Viola; Mr. Mark Lord, Bb and Piccolo Trumpets, and Fluegelhorn; Mr. Bruce Kanzelmeyer, F. Horn and Recorders; Stan Fortmeyer (Rev.), Gene Savoy Jr., and Bradley Buchanan, Handbells and Miscellaneous Percussion; Sean Savoy, Harpsichord; Jalayne Grady, Orchestral Bells; Ms. Diane Maurer, Vibraphone; and Jacklynn Carrothers (Rev.), Organist and Chorus Mistress.

All music for the ensemble is composed by The Reverend Buchanan. Mr. Mark Lord executes needed additional arrangements and copying of parts.

The Sinfonietta is also rehearsing new vocal selections featuring the Children's Chorus and Jamilian Handbell Choir. Singing with the ensemble and choir will be The Reverend Doctor Tyrus Peace, bass soloist.

Premiere performances of the Sinfonietta are scheduled for the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons, in December and early next year. ♦

Mail out-reach campaign continues

Program contacts over 150,000 individuals

The national out-reach campaign, begun last January 6, Epiphany, continues with encouraging results. Inquiries have increased a hundred-fold and many serious candidates are being considered for enrollment in The Academy of the Sacred College Jamilian University of the Ordained, through its Extension Program.

The Academy's study program has been restructured. Emphasis is being placed on personal training in the oral tradition under qualified and authorized tutors, preceptors, and teaching assistants in special seminars held in Reno at various times of

the year. During training, attendance to Saturday Services is required.

The mail out-reach program, as a tool of the Church, has the responsibility of informing every American of the news of the Second Advent. This year's mail campaign was aimed at fifty of the largest metropolitan areas of the country, and was initiated in combination with advertisements appearing in major national magazines such as *Psychology Today*, *East-West Journal*, *New Age*, and *Fate*.

The new Millennium Editions of *The Decoded New Testament*, *The Essai*

Document, and *The Lost Gospel of Jesus* — primer texts for exegetical studies — and an entirely new volume, *The Miracle of the Second Advent*, an overview of Second Adventism, are also being released in conjunction with the mail out-reach program.

Over 150,000 individuals have been contacted thus far. Mail-out target dates met through this fall are: January 6 (14, 706 letters), February 2 (17,641 letters), April 14 (19, 477 letters), June 6 (19, 564 letters), July 1 (19, 198 letters), July 15 (29, 021 letters), August 14 (14, 149 letters), September 3 (15, 257 letters), and September 21 (4, 054 letters).

In charge of the mail campaign is The Reverend Robert de la Cruz who works under the direct overseership of The Most Right Reverend Gene Savoy.

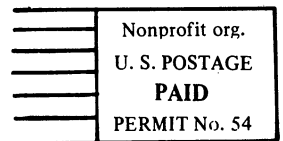
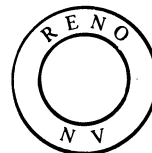
