New Clergy Program Established For Reno Residents

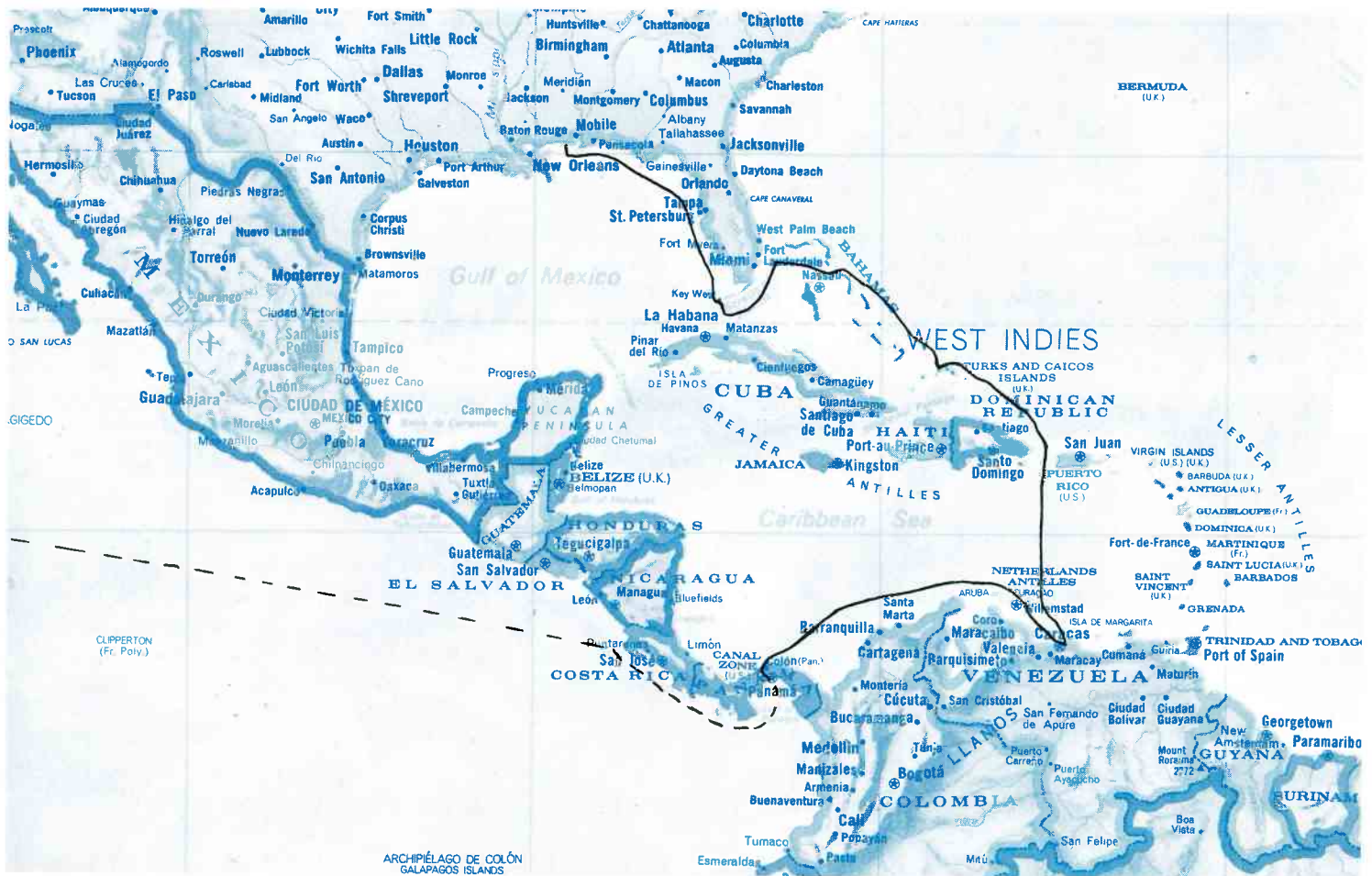
Twenty-four residents of the Community were selected in January, 1978, for the First Clergy training program, taught weekly by Rt. Rev. Gene Savoy. This program is the third step for those who have completed correspondence studies and wish to be considered for a three-year residence program of advanced oral teachings.

The First Clergy are designated as direct disciples of the revealed religion of the Church of the Second Advent. The Church represents the New Teachings of Light as transmitted through the office of Christ, incarnate in flesh in the person of Jamil, the Christ Child of the Andes. Members of the First Clergy program are assigned the mission of creating

the nucleus for the new universal religion of Light, a Community of order and unity that can be penetrated by the Worlds of Light for the establishment of a divine theocracy on this planet. The First Clergy are being trained as professional teachers of Light and will be required to perform all sacred rituals and ceremonies that bind the Church of the Second Advent to the Christ force. The new clergy are being thoroughly precepted in the concepts, supplements and amendments to the New Dispensation as it fulfills the teachings of Jesus, Buddha, Mohammed, Quetzalcoatl and other founders of former revealed religions.

FEATHERED SERPENT II TO SAIL TO HAWAII

After completing its Venezuelan mission in November, the Feathered Serpent II was docked on the Balboa side of the Panama Canal to undergo further repairs for the next leg of its journey to Hawaii. Chris Radzik, Robert de la Cruz and James Humphrey are stationed in Panama, supervising the ship's refitting. The ship is being outfitted with a new propulsion engine and a new generator engine. Additionally, the standing rigging is being changed, the deck recaulked and a new 3-burner stove installed. The projected departure date of the FS II is mid-May, when it is scheduled to sail up the coast of Central America, west to Honolulu, Hawaii, arriving there about July 20. At that time, a special Project X seminar will be held on the role of the Hawaiian Kahunas in ancient solar religions. A meeting of the Order of the Holy Child is also scheduled. A special agenda will be sent to members of Ship's Company concerning further details of the Hawaiian expedition.
