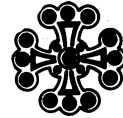




Community Communique

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STATE OF THE WORLD. An unusually large number of earthquakes, tidal waves and other natural disturbances reported around the world confirm the predictions of Jamil in *First Prophecy to the Americas*. JUST OFF THE PRESS. *First Prophecy to the Americas*, in the series: *The Prophecies of Jamil*, is now off the press. Both the limited *Amatl* edition and the facsimile edition are now available. *Second Prophecy to the Americas* is scheduled to come off the press December 20th and will be available on that date (popular edition only). The *Amatl* edition will be delayed owing to the difficulties in Mexico. However, the paper made from tree bark is on its way to Reno from the interior of Mexico.

PROJECT "X"—*The Search for the Secrets of Immortality*, by Gene Savoy, is being published by Bobbs-Merrill and will be available in bookstores in March of 1977. This book describes the early research conducted by members of the Community in Peru, Mexico, and Amazonia. The techniques are discussed and the importance of the sun and its effect upon the brain and nervous system is brought out into the open for the first time. We feel after twenty years of silence it is time to talk more openly about the research being conducted by the International Community of Christ. The work of members of the Community has been given the name Project "X" in the book. Good reading. A must for every Cosolargist.

PROPHECIES PLANNED FOR 1977. *The Prophecies of Jamil* will continue in the Mediterranean area during 1977. Full particulars on the readings and how Associates may participate will be announced in a special packet to be mailed to all Associates in January.

MONK DE JURE PROGRAM. Members who have been invited to attend the first annual meeting to be held December 17, 18 and 19, at the Rectory-Abbey, can expect to receive the first in a series of *Secret Sayings of Jamil* reserved for members of the Order. The teachings throw light upon the illumination that can be realized by those applying The System. Of special significance are practical methods of attaining enlightenment which have not been available to the correspondent. All members not in attendance will receive oral teachings by tape and the *Sayings* in a beautiful bound volume.

RESEARCH LINE. Associates have been given the opportunity of qualifying for the special research team that will assist the Center in compiling useful information on reactions to theory and practice by those in the field. A special telephone line is open to each Associate once monthly so questions may be asked. We hope to solve the problem of late answers to questions contained in letters. A small folder * explaining the use of this line has been mailed to all Associates.

THE SACRED COLLEGE. The benefits of the Sacred College are varied. In addition to the tapes and books, Associates are brought closer to the teachings through techniques taught by Rev. Gene Savoy during seminars held at the Center for this purpose. Every Associate who has completed studies in the Academy should go on to complete studies in the Sacred College, thereby qualifying for the many benefits that would not be available otherwise to those who have not completed the prescribed studies. These benefits will become magnified as the Community begins its building program. Graduates are assured participation in research and resident teaching upon qualification and acceptance. The importance of the training cannot be over-emphasized.

OPENING AT THE CENTER. Over the next year the Center will require the services of three persons with experience in either secretarial work, typing, filing or printing. We prefer persons who have completed studies in the Academy and those with some income or retirement pay, although this is not a requirement. Work at the Center is one of devotion and great dedication; all Associates here have taken vows of dedication to the Work. Those interested should write or telephone Sylvia Savoy or Carol Salverson.

BUILDING PLANS. Plans for the building of a world center are now underway. Members of the project will be those who have completed studies in the Sacred College. While the building is still some years off, plans are being formulated and members are presently being trained for positions there. We will be mailing all Associates particulars on the construction of the Temple of Light and the City of Light early next year.

IMPORTANCE OF MAINTAINING CLOSE RAPPORT. Associates should try to keep in touch with the Center at all times. Financial difficulties should not be a cause to withdraw from the studies, nor should "slow" reactions or progress be a reason for discouragement. There are no short-cuts to the attainment of enlightenment and constant application, regardless of external conditions and circumstances, is the only sure route. Associates should remember that there is always an ordained minister at the Center ready to assist the Associate.
