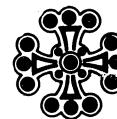

PROJECT X BOOK OUT IN LATE JUNE Although the Project X book has been delayed a few months from the anticipated date of March, it will be released from our publisher, Bobbs-Merrill, at the end of June. The full title of our book is: Project X: The Search for the Secrets of Immortality. We are encouraging Community members to order our book through their local book store since this will naturally create a much wider base of public appeal. This book will make an excellent gift for any friends who might be interested in the work of the Community, and especially those who may need to understand the concepts of Cosolargy from a more intellectual or scientific viewpoint.

THE PURPOSE OF PROJECT X Project X will not replace or duplicate the current programs and publications of the Community which are primarily aimed at orientation and instruction in the religious and ministerial work of the Community. Rather, Project X will be an educational branch sponsored by the Community which will allow members of the public to become familiar with the basic concepts of Cosolargy and to contribute to our growing body of research. In addition to our Project X book, a brochure will also be released by the Community which will outline the basic curriculum for lay persons and urge those of the scientific and humanistic professions to contribute in building a new life science based on the principles of Cosolargy. Those who have completed studies in Project X can then elect to go on to the Community's more advanced, spiritual programs, if they so choose.

ROUTE OF THE FEATHERED SERPENT Serpent II departed Pascagoula, Mississippi, where it has been berthed since January 1st, on June 16 after some delays on repairs and outfitting. The ship sailed south between Cuba and Yucatan and made for Venezuela where it will enter the Orinoco river for several weeks. Here the crew will gather information and photographs for a book on El Dorado to be published next year.

From Venezuela, Serpent II will sail south to the Amazon and thence to the west coast of Africa. From there she will enter the Mediterranean and work her way to Egypt or Israel, depending upon the political climate. The ship will receive visitors possibly in September, allowing for weather and delays, or between that time and December. A Christmas gathering is also planned.

FEATHERED SERPENT II CREW In addition to Gene Savoy, who will be captain of the Feathered Serpent, three other staff persons will serve on the ship. These include Phil Snyder as the ship's navigator; John Mahan, communications and executive officer, and Robert de la Cruz, chief steward. Three other persons from the Community will also serve on the Feathered Serpent II:

PAT NEWMAN Mr. Newman is from Montreal, Canada and is a broadcast systems engineer for CBC (Canadian Broadcast Corporation) and a graduate of the University of Alberta. Mr. Newman has 20 years of sailing experience and is a schooner buff, having sailed many well-known schooners including the La Golita, the Wild Harp, the William Moir, and the Adventure. Mr. Newman will serve as the ship's first mate.

CHRIS RADZIK Mr. Radzik is from Laurencewood, Illinois, where he was employed as a mechanical supervisor for a building firm. Mr. Radzik has 15 years sailing experience and will be the ship's engineer.

WAYNE LANGLEY Mr. Langley is from Pembroke, Ontario, and has been employed as a Canoe Ranger for the Algonquin Provincial Park and has also attended Carlton University. Mr. Langley will be quartermaster for the Feathered Serpent.

PHASE I OF CHILDREN'S SCHOOL BEGINS The Community has now entered Phase I in developing an elementary and mid-school for the children of our Associates. Our first step is a pilot project with the two Savoy children, Geno and Sean. When sufficient interest and resources have been manifested we will enter Phase II - a fully functional and accredited facility. In addition to offering an orthodox curriculum, the Community's school will provide children with an elementary foundation in the theologies and technologies of Cosolargy as well as pioneer new educational techniques that can accelerate the child's spiritual growth.
