Cherie Jamason



Cherie Jamason has been at the helm of the Food Bank of Northern Nevada since 1988. During that time, FBNN grew from a small grass-roots food assistance program serving Washoe County to a nationally recognized anti-hunger organization, providing services throughout the state of Nevada.

Under Cherie's leadership, FBNN has been widely recognized for its integrity, accountability and excellence in non-profit management, and for the creation of community partnerships to serve the needs of children. Her food bank is currently in the top 10% of food banks nationally and has pioneered the development of innovative programs which have captured the imagination of the national network, becoming recognized as the expert on hunger issues in Nevada by state policy and decision makers, local municipalities, human service organizations and the media.


Cherie was instrumental in creating Nevada's first State Food Security Plan in which food security was named as one of the core functions of the state's government for the first time. She has also been a driving force behind the new Bridges to a Thriving Nevada, an initiative which takes on poverty, one of hunger's most damaging root causes. Cherie has been the recipient of local and national awards and recognitions for her work on hunger and child nutrition issues, most recently the 2014 Unite4: Humanity Inspiration Award, the 2014 John Van Hengel Leadership Award by Feeding America. Cherie was recognized as a Distinguished Nevadan by the University of Nevada in 2010. Under her leadership, FBNN was recognized as the 2013 Food Bank Member of the Year. In 2014, Ms. Jamason was appointed by Senator Harry Reid to the ten-member National Hunger Commission.


Col. Charles "Chuck" Fulkerson

As an Army Ranger, Chuck served two combat tours in Viet Nam and three tours in Germany, earning two Legions

of Merit, two Bronze Stars and the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry. He also earned the Nevada Distinguished Service Medal and the National Guard Bureau's Eagle Award for Outstanding Service. But his most prized honor was the G.I.'s Officer Award, an award bestowed on him by his peers. Chuck also inducted into the UNR ROTC Hall of Fame.

Regarding our veteran's as America's heroes, Chuck co-founded the Spouse House in Reno in 1991, which became the Veterans Guest House, opening with 4 beds in 1994. The facility was rebuilt in 2004 and again in 2012. The Guest House provides overnight lodging for veterans and their families who receive medical care at the Veterans Administration Medical Center, as well as for veterans who receive long term outpatient care.





In 2006, the University of Nevada Board of Regents named him a Distinguished Nevadan – a humanitarian who always put others before himself. He received The Four Chaplains' Legion of Honor Humanitarian Award, a national award given in recognition of a lifetime commitment to selfless service and societal advancement that has demonstrably affected the quality of life in the community, state or nation, service without regard to faith or race.

Over 500 people attended his memorial on Nov. 1, 2014, filling the hangar at the Stead Army Aviation Facility, to honor a dedicated man, veteran, father, grandfather, and loving husband.

Northern Nevada HOPES

HOPES is a non-profit community health center dedicated to building a healthier community by providing coordinated care and support for individual and family wellness. They provide discounted services on a sliding fee scale, providing primary care, chronic disease management, behavioral health counseling, case management, nutrition counseling, on-site pharmacy, transportation, HIV and hepatitis C, and community outreach and education. In 1997 they began as a comprehensive HIV care center and expanded in 2012 to a



primary medical care center. HOPES relies on continued support and generosity to provide affordable, quality healthcare to the community: 92% of every dollar goes directly to patient care. HOPES develops programs based on the unmet needs within the community, focusing on helping medically underserved groups such as seniors, the uninsured and underinsured, and people experiencing homelessness. After months of planning, HOPES is now embarking on the construction of a new three-story, 37,400 sq. ft. medical facility in downtown Reno.
