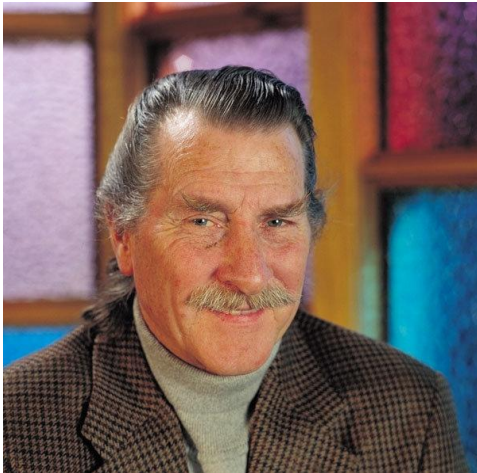

The Feathered Serpent III Destroyed in Storm, August 20, 1998



August 20th, twenty-two years ago, saw the destruction of Gene Savoy's exploration vessel, the Feathered Serpent III – Ophir, during a storm. The ship was a 73-foot double-hulled, canoe-type, catamaran. Constructed by hand of Peruvian mahogany and lashed together with rope, the vessel was a replica of designs found on pre-Inca ceramics and of traditional Polynesian craft.

The FSIII - Ophir had departed from the Escuela Naval in Callao on December 17, 1997, and arrived in Radio Bay at Hilo, Hawaii on January 28, 1998, completing a 42-day voyage with no motor from the land of the Incas. Savoy's purpose was to show that the ancients were capable of sailing around the globe using similar ships on well-known sea routes.
